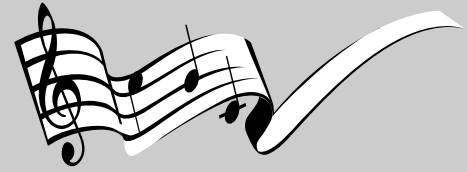

Beware of scams & fraud

Fraudsters never give up, and they're always thinking of new ways to get your cash.



Cruise ship scams— Your "prize" cruise phone call or mailing may ask for your credit card number (fraudulently) or may charge more in "port fees" than you would normally pay for the whole cruise. You may have to book a second guest at an inflated price. Some scams just want you to call an expensive "900" or other phone number (no real cruise).

"Spearphishing" - Email spammers are getting more specific using your name or asking for your credit card number for a problem with your recent purchase. Where do they get this information — social networks, hacking of big corporate computers, hacking of email accounts.

Always maintain a healthy dose of suspicion about email that names you. Legitimate companies won't ask you for personal or financial information. And if it looks like the email is coming from a friend who needs money...give them a call.

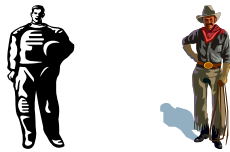

John & Annie Glenn Museum
National Road/Zane Grey Museum
New Concord, Ohio

The John & Annie Glenn Historic Site is a living history tour. Characters in period clothing will take you on a tour of his boyhood home. They'll give a captivating presentation about life during the Great Depression in 1937 and the Home Front during WWII in 1944. Tour also includes: a movie, gallery and John's room with special treasures from his past.

The National Road started in Cumberland, Maryland and ended in Illinois when they ran out of money. Begun in 1806, the "Main Street of America" was the only significant land link between east coast and western frontier in the early 19th century. A 136 foot diorama of the National Road plus many objects illustrate this theme.

Zane Grey was born in Zanesville and authored many thrilling stories about the Old West like "Riders of the Purple Sage." His Californian study is recreated and displays include many manuscripts and memorabilia.
